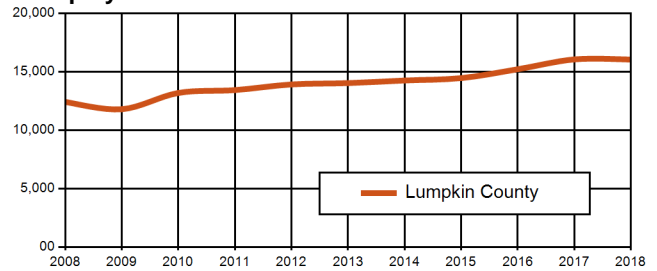

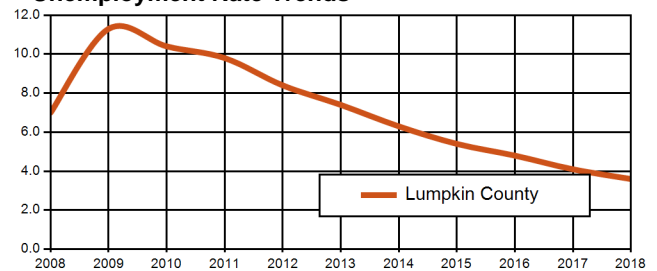

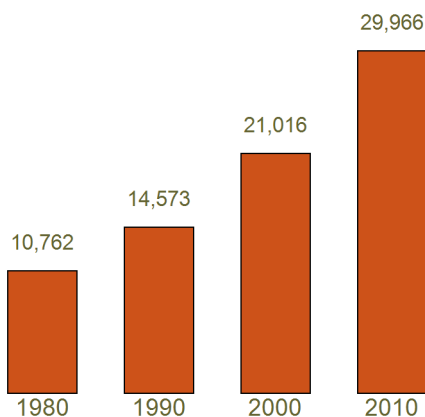

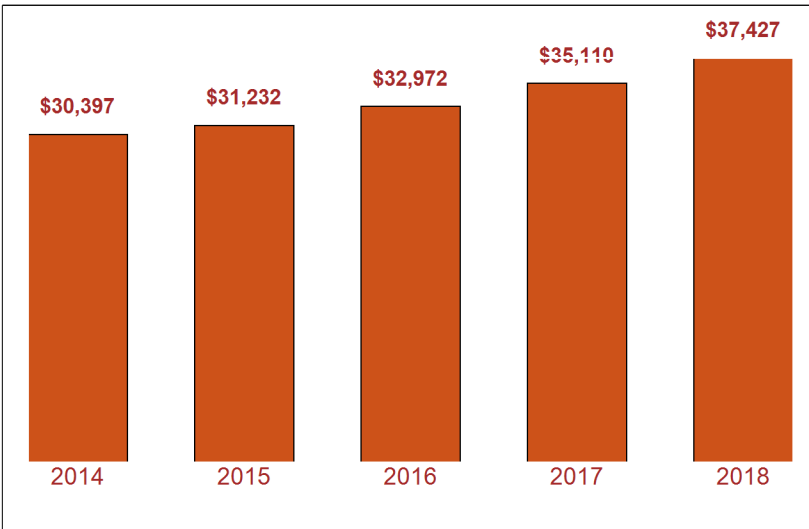

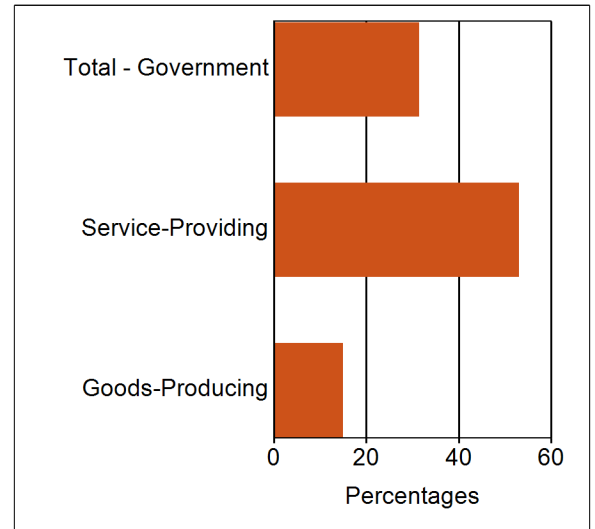
Lumpkin Per Capita Income
