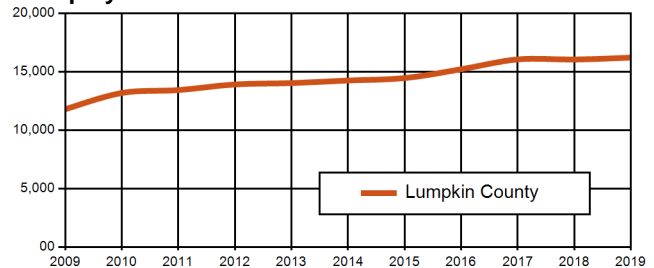

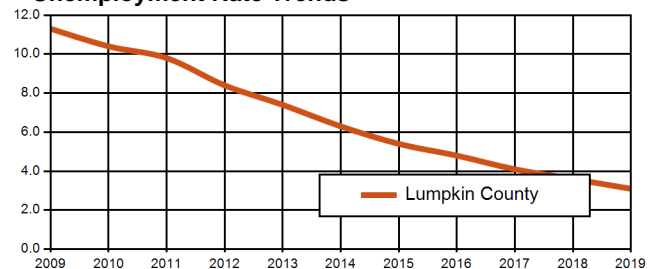

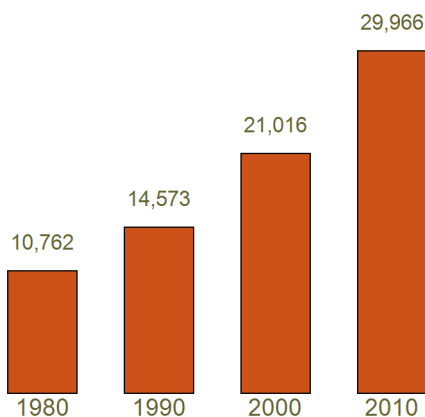

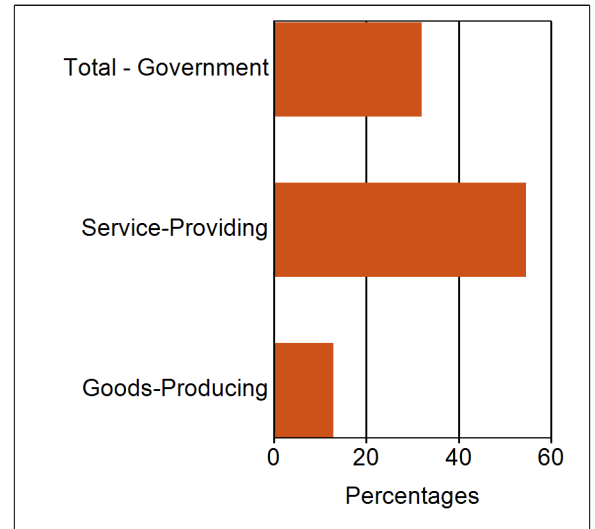
## Lumpkin Per Capita Income
