

Broadband Infrastructure

At a special ground breaking ceremony held on June 29, Gov. Brian Kemp announced approximately 8,000 locations in unserved and underserved parts of Lumpkin County will soon be eligible for high-speed fiber internet. The infrastructure project is a result of a public—private partnership between Lumpkin County Government, the Development Authority of Lumpkin County, and Kinetic. Kinetic's financial match of approximately \$13.4 million made it possible for the Development Authority of Lumpkin County and Lumpkin County Government to obtain an additional \$7.3 million in state and federal grants. The \$20.7 million project will enable Kinetic to lay more than 450 miles of optical fiber cable and is expected to be completed in 2024.

\$11,275,000 Grant Announced for the Lumpkin County Water & Sewerage Authority

The office of Governor Brian Kemp recently notified Lumpkin County Government of an \$11,275,000 grant award to the Lumpkin County Water & Sewerage Authority. The award is for engineering, design, and construction of a new wastewater treatment plant and collection system. The wastewater treatment plant and collection system will be constructed in the southern part of Lumpkin County to support the Northeast Georgia Medical Center-Lumpkin and other development expected along Ga. SR 400. Construction on the facility is scheduled to be complete by 2026 and will be constructed with an ultimate capacity of 1 million gallons per day.

Yahoola Creek Reservoir Master Plan Implementation

Lumpkin County Government was awarded \$62,207 in grant funding from the Georgia Department of Natural Resources Recreational Trail Program. The grant funding will go towards enhancing the Yahoola Creek Reservoir property by adding approximately two miles of new pedestrian trails, realigning the existing Hwy 52-E pedestrian trail, and installing two trailhead kiosks and four trail wayfinding signs. This trail project is in response to the Yahoola Creek Reservoir Master Plan adopted by the Lumpkin County Board of Commissioners on January 5, 2021.
